Purpose of this document

This official guide brings together the SCO International Finance Olympiad syllabus pathway, cycle-based exam schedule, school implementation rules, student conduct expectations, secure proctored exam policy, result governance and stakeholder benefits into one clear rules-and-regulations framework.

1. Official Scope and Learning Promise

The SCO International Finance Olympiad (SCO IFKO) is a grade-wise international finance knowledge competition for students in Grades 1-12. It is designed to build financial literacy, digital-money safety, real-life money reasoning, ethical decision-making, and future career awareness through an age-progressive Olympiad pathway.

The Olympiad moves students from simple recognition of money and value in early grades to budgeting, banking, digital payments, credit, insurance, investing, entrepreneurship, risk, market behavior, macroeconomics, valuation and regulation in higher grades. This progression supports the global need for practical financial literacy rather than rote memorization.

- **Knowledge goal:** students understand money, value, savings, budgeting, digital payments, banking, insurance, credit, investment and ethical financial behavior at their grade level.
- **Pedagogy goal:** students solve real-life scenarios, compare alternatives, justify decisions, identify risk and apply finance concepts responsibly.
- **Integrity goal:** SCO protects result value through online/offline proctored delivery, clear candidate rules and policy-based anti-cheating review.
- **Inclusion goal:** registered students receive access to SCO study materials, practice resources and preparation support, including multilingual readiness wherever applicable on the SCO platform.

2. Why Finance Knowledge Is an Urgent Global Skill

Financial literacy is now a core life skill because students encounter money decisions early: digital payments, subscriptions, online shopping, saving, family budgeting, UPI or card payments, bank accounts, insurance, scholarships, education costs, entrepreneurship and career planning. A strong school-level Finance Olympiad helps students form safe and ethical habits before they make higher-stakes financial choices.

- The Indian context demands early digital-finance awareness because students and families increasingly interact with mobile banking, QR payments, UPI, cards, online shopping and digital wallets.
- The global context demands real-life decision-making because young people must compare costs, understand risk, avoid fraud, identify trusted information and plan for future education and careers.
- The school context demands structured assessment because finance learning is often scattered across mathematics, commerce, economics, business studies, ICT and life-skills lessons.
- The family context demands practical language: needs versus wants, saving, sharing, budgeting, borrowing, interest, emergency funds, protection, and responsible investment behavior.

SCO pedagogy standard

Every finance topic should be taught through a five-step pathway: Concept -> Example -> Real-life Situation -> Decision -> Ethical Reflection. This makes SCO IFKO more than a test; it becomes a structured financial-literacy movement for schools and families.

3. Eligibility and Participation Rules

Rule Area	SCO IFKO Regulation
Eligible Grades	Students from Grades 1-12 may participate according to their current school grade or equivalent international level.
Participation Mode	Participation may be through school/institution registration or individual registration, as allowed by the SCO registration flow.
Exam Level	SCO may conduct national/international stages or cycle-based stages according to the official published exam structure.
Syllabus Basis	Questions are based on the grade-wise SCO IFKO syllabus pathway, with real-life application, logical reasoning and financial judgment.
Language and Access	Exam and preparation access follow the official SCO platform settings. Learning support may be available in multiple languages where configured.
Student Identity	The participant must use the registered name, grade, school/institution details and login credentials assigned by SCO. Impersonation is strictly prohibited.
Fair Attempt	Every student must attempt independently without external help, unauthorized notes, AI tools, search engines, messaging apps or another person's assistance.

4. Official Exam Pattern and Candidate Guidance

The SCO IFKO exam is designed as a 60-minute finance knowledge assessment with multiple-choice questions, logical reasoning, problem-solving and scenario-based financial decision-making. The exact number of questions, marks, negative marking and stage rules should follow the latest official SCO exam page, registration instructions and admit-card guidance for the selected cycle.

Component	Guidance for Students and Schools
Duration	Usually 60 minutes unless the official cycle/admit card specifies otherwise.
Question Type	MCQs, application-based scenarios, reasoning, comparison, ethics and real-life finance decisions.
Grade Fit	Difficulty and content increase progressively from Grade 1 to Grade 12.
Preparation Access	Registered students receive login access to SCO preparation resources such as study materials, practice questions, sample papers, mock tests and reports as applicable.
Device Readiness	A stable device, internet connection, browser access, camera/microphone permission and quiet exam space are required for online proctored exams.
Attempt Rule	Students must not refresh, switch tabs, open external apps or use unauthorized help during the exam.

Final Score	Final score and rank may be subject to completion status, proctoring review, policy compliance and official result-publish schedule.
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5. Cycle-Based Exam Schedule Rules

SCO uses a cycle-based exam calendar so that schools, parents and international participants can choose a suitable exam window. Each cycle groups available exam dates by month and presents active Olympiads in a clearer public view. The official SCO exam-date page remains the live public reference for currently open cycles and registration actions.

Important schedule rule

Date options must be treated as cycle-based. Students choose one available date in the active SCO IFKO cycle. Schools should verify the final live schedule from the SCO exam-date page before announcing a school-wide exam date.

6. Grade 1-12 Syllabus Pathway and Learning Expectations

The SCO IFKO syllabus is designed as a progressive curriculum. Younger students build money recognition and decision habits; middle-grade students learn budgeting, banking, interest, digital payments and credit; senior students apply investment, business, macroeconomic, valuation, regulation and ethics concepts.

Grades 1-2	Money recognition, value, needs/wants, earning, spending, saving and simple records.	Observe, classify, count, choose responsibly, explain simple decisions.
Grades 3-4	Saving, sharing, price, change, bank vs piggy bank, deposits, withdrawals and early interest concepts.	Compare value, track balances, interpret simple transactions, revise budgets.
Grades 5-6	Currency, needs/wants in context, budgeting, savings accounts, simple interest, loans and digital payments.	Calculate, compare, plan, evaluate safety and explain digital-payment responsibility.
Grades 7-8	Compound interest, emergency funds, insurance, taxes, credit/debit cards, advanced budgeting and ethical giving.	Model scenarios, estimate risk, use spreadsheets, identify responsible credit behavior.
Grades 9-10	Stocks, bonds, funds, markets, diversification, behavioral finance, statements, cash flow, break-even and credit scores.	Analyze trade-offs, interpret data, solve business cases and justify investment decisions.

Grades 11-12	Mutual funds/ETFs, risk metrics, alternative assets, retirement planning, macroeconomics, valuation, forex, ethics and regulation.	Apply quantitative methods, assess suitability, test assumptions and reason ethically.
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7. Core Rules for Students

1. Use only the registered SCO login credentials assigned to the student. Do not share login details with another person.
2. Attempt the exam independently. No parent, teacher, friend, tuition instructor, AI chatbot, search engine, messaging app or external helper may assist during the exam.
3. Keep the exam tab active throughout the test. Avoid tab switching, minimizing the browser, opening new apps or using external devices.
4. Read every question carefully and answer within the given time. Questions may test real-life reasoning, not only definitions.
5. Do not use calculators, notes, textbooks, mobile phones, smart watches or online resources unless a specific official instruction allows it.
6. Keep webcam/microphone permissions enabled where the online proctored exam requires them.
7. Remain visible in the exam space and avoid movement that may create integrity risk or trigger proctor review.
8. Do not copy, photograph, record, reproduce or share question content before, during or after the exam.
9. Submit the exam before the timer ends and follow any final confirmation screen carefully.
10. Accept that the final result may be reviewed for completion status, irregular activity and proctor-policy compliance.

8. Secure Proctored Exam and Anti-Cheating Regulations

SCO International Olympiad uses a secure online exam model that captures integrity signals during the attempt. The goal is not to create fear; the goal is to protect honest students, give schools confidence in online results and ensure that certificates, ranks and awards retain their value.

Integrity Area	Rule / Regulation	Possible Action if Violated
Identity	Student must attempt under the correct registered identity.	Attempt may be held for review or disqualified.
Camera / Mic Readiness	Where required, camera and microphone permissions must remain enabled.	Attempt may be flagged for verification.
Tab Activity	Student should not switch away from the exam tab or use external browsing.	Risk band may increase; score may be reviewed under policy.
External Help	No human assistance, AI tool, messaging, web search, notes or unauthorized device may be used.	Attempt may be cancelled or marked invalid.
Multiple People	No other person should guide or communicate answers during the exam.	Attempt may be reviewed and disqualified if unfair help is detected.

Content Security	Questions, screenshots, recordings and answer content must not be copied or shared.	Participant may lose eligibility for result/certificate and face account restriction.
Technical Misuse	Deliberate refreshes, network manipulation, browser back, or repeated unusual behavior are not allowed.	Attempt may be held for technical and proctor review.
Fair Review	SCO may use policy-based risk bands and human/admin review before applying penalties where required.	Final decision follows SCO result governance.

Anti-cheating fairness principle

A proctor flag is an integrity signal, not automatically a final penalty. SCO should review patterns, severity, technical context and policy band before final action. This supports both exam integrity and procedural fairness.

9. Rules for Schools and Institutions

- **Calendar planning:** schools should select a cycle and communicate exam windows early to students and parents.
- **Registration accuracy:** student names, grades, email IDs, school names and country details should be verified before submission.
- **Preparation support:** schools should encourage students to use SCO free study materials, practice questions, sample papers, timed mock tests and performance reports.
- **Exam environment:** schools should provide a quiet, stable and supervised exam environment for school-based online/offline participation.
- **Integrity briefing:** schools should brief students about tab switching, unauthorized help, device rules and the value of honest participation.
- **Parent communication:** schools should share exam dates, login instructions, proctor rules, result-publish dates and support channels in advance.
- **Inclusive participation:** schools should help students from different language and learning backgrounds access preparation support wherever available.

10. Rules for Teachers

Teachers play the most important role in converting the Finance Olympiad from a one-day exam into a meaningful learning journey. The recommended teacher approach is to blend finance vocabulary, maths reasoning, life-skills discussion, ICT awareness and ethical decision-making.

Teacher Responsibility	Practical Implementation
Chapter Orientation	Explain the grade-wise finance topics using classroom examples, stories and simple decision cases.
Concept Practice	Use short practice sets for money recognition, budgeting, interest, digital payment safety and financial choices.
Scenario Discussion	Ask students to justify decisions, compare alternatives and identify risk in everyday situations.
Assessment Readiness	Use timed practice and mock tests to build speed, accuracy and confidence.
Ethics Guidance	Discuss honesty, fair borrowing, responsible spending, fraud prevention and consumer protection.

Result Follow-Up

Use performance feedback to identify learning gaps and guide future preparation.

11. Rules and Guidance for Parents

- **Encourage discussion:** talk about saving, needs, wants, budgeting, price comparison and safe digital payments in age-appropriate language.
- **Support preparation:** help students access SCO study materials and practice resources, but do not provide answers during exams.
- **Protect independence:** allow the student to attempt the Olympiad honestly. The result should reflect the student's own knowledge.
- **Create exam readiness:** ensure device, internet, login, quiet space and camera/microphone permissions are ready before the test.
- **Build habit value:** use the Olympiad as a positive family-learning activity, not only as a rank competition.

13. SCO Platform Value-Addition Rules

The SCO Finance Olympiad should be positioned not only as an exam but as a complete preparation ecosystem. Registered students can access SCO's online learning environment, including study materials, practice questions, sample papers, timed mock tests and performance analysis where available on the platform.

14. Result, Ranking, Certificate and Award Governance

1. Results should be published according to the official cycle and result-publish date.
2. Score, rank, certificate eligibility and award category should be generated only after the attempt is completed and any required proctor review is applied.
3. If suspicious activity is found, SCO may review the attempt before finalizing the result.
4. Certificates and awards should reflect verified final results, not provisional or incomplete attempts.
5. Tie rules, country ranking, international ranking, school-wise awards and recognition policies should follow SCO's official award and result policy.
6. Students and schools should check the result portal and official communications for final verified results.

15. Technical Issue and Support Rules

Situation	Recommended Rule
Login issue before exam	Student/school should contact support before the scheduled slot where possible.
Internet drop during exam	The attempt may be reviewed based on system logs, completion status and proctor signals.
Device or camera issue	Student should resolve permissions before starting; repeated camera/mic failures may trigger review.
Wrong grade or student details	Corrections should be requested before the exam/result cycle wherever possible.
Payment or registration issue	Registration and payment confirmation should be verified before attempting the exam.
Appeal or review request	SCO may evaluate logs, policy bands, attempt data and submitted evidence before deciding.

16. Finance Olympiad Ethics Code

SCO IFKO should build not only finance knowledge but also responsible financial character. Students should learn that finance is connected to fairness, honesty, protection, transparency and long-term trust.

- Use financial knowledge to make informed and responsible choices.
- Respect privacy, passwords, bank details and personal financial information.
- Do not promote scams, risky speculation, fraud, illegal gains or misleading financial claims.

- Understand that investing and borrowing require risk awareness, not blind confidence.
- Value ethical earning, saving, giving, spending, taxation, insurance and financial planning.
- Recognize that good finance knowledge protects families, communities and future careers.

17. Global Alignment and Research Foundation

The SCO Finance Olympiad rules and pedagogy are aligned with major international themes in financial education: practical decision-making, digital-finance safety, trusted information, real-life application, ethical behavior and school-family participation. This alignment supports the demand for a globally relevant Finance Olympiad that works in Indian and international contexts.
